Because of the Center's help, I now have the strength, power, ability and desire to help others through their hard times. 



From the family of Jerry French ...



On May 12, 2006, we suffered tragic loss. Our brother, Jerry French, was robbed and murdered in his home in South Arkansas. Our cousins, who work closely with an organization (the Center for Healing Hearts and Spirits) that works with victims of violent crimes, contacted the

organization on behalf of our family.

Our cousin, Maurice, met with the Center's executive director, Joyce Raynor. She helped us fill out the necessary paperwork to get reimbursed for Jerry's funeral costs as well as costs associated with the crime scene. Ms. Raynor did more than just fill out the paperwork; she stayed in contact with us several times to see how we were doing and the progress of my brother's case. She also offered to go to court with us.

No one ever knows if he or she will ever need this type of service, but our family is grateful that it was available to us.
